AT A GLANCE

Inspire, advocate, and help your gifted students excel.

Are you a licensed teacher in Virginia looking for a pathway to teach gifted students or simply better ways to support the gifted students with whom you work?

Acquire the skills and expertise necessary to teach and support students with diverse learning needs through Longwood University's online Gifted Education Add-On Endorsement coursework. Our courses are fully online and asynchronous, allowing busy teachers the opportunity to work when their schedules permit. Teachers holding an official bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university and a valid Virginia teaching license are eligible to apply for this coursework.

Coursework

Enhance your knowledge and skills in gifted student assessment, identification, instruction and support through our gifted education courses. To apply for a Gifted Education Add-On Endorsement, the Virginia Department of Education Licensure Regulations for School Personnel (8VAC20-23-370) specify a requirement of 12 semester hours of graduate-level coursework across specific topic areas in gifted education. That's just four courses to meet the coursework requirement for the endorsement!

Additional Requirements

In addition to the coursework, your school will need to verify to the VDOE that you have completed one year of successful, full-time teaching experience with gifted students in a public or an accredited nonpublic school with an assigned teacher-mentor holding a valid license with an endorsement in gifted education. Longwood does not offer a practicum.

VDOE requires 3 core courses (9 credits) and 1 elective (3 credits) for a total of 12 credits.



ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Official bachelor's degree transcript from a regionally accredited college or university
- Valid Virginia Teaching License

- Knowledge of gifted learner traits and characteristics
- Strategies for implementing gifted instruction in the regular classroom
- Assessment strategies targeted for gifted students
- Instructional differentiation for gifted students
- Knowledge of social and emotional development of gifted learners
- Advocacy and support for gifted students and their families

TUITION AND FEES

Based on current tuition rates, tuition costs \$285* per credit for Virginia residents and \$355* per credit for non-Virginia residents, plus a one-time application fee. All courses are three credits. The University offers a monthly payment plan option for fall and spring.
